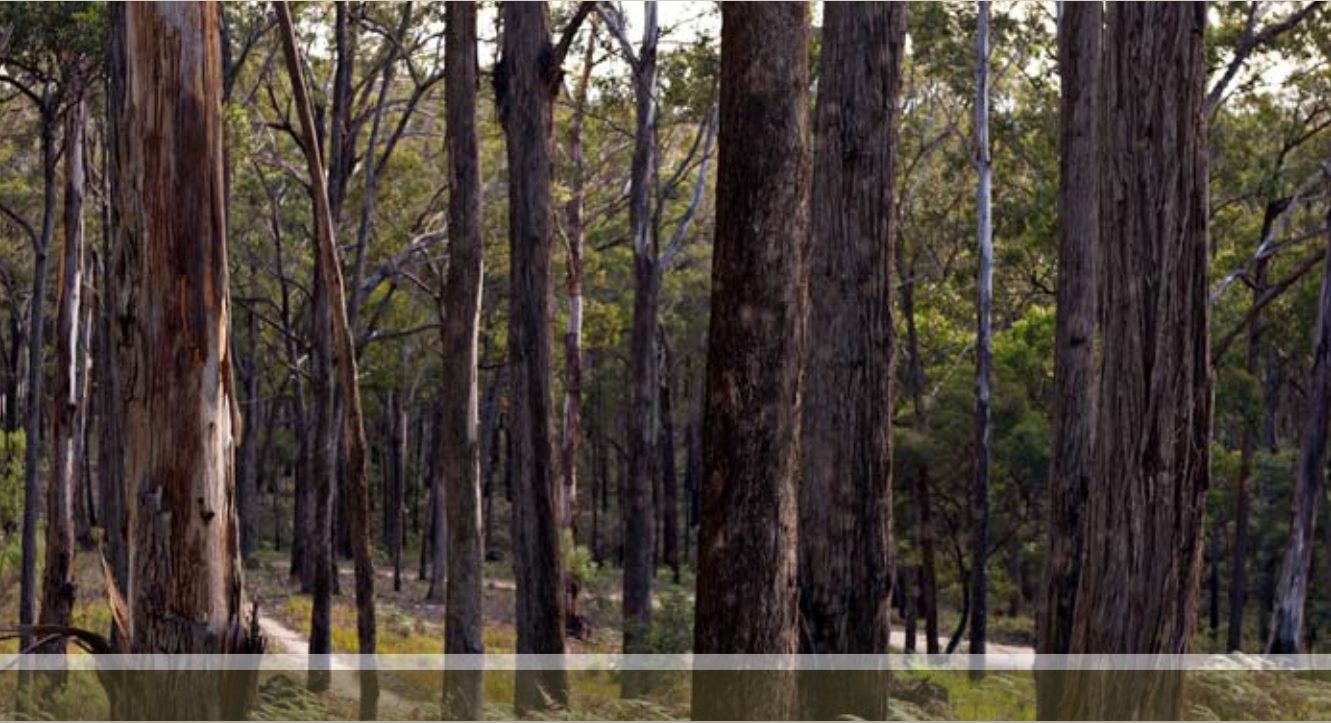

# Overview

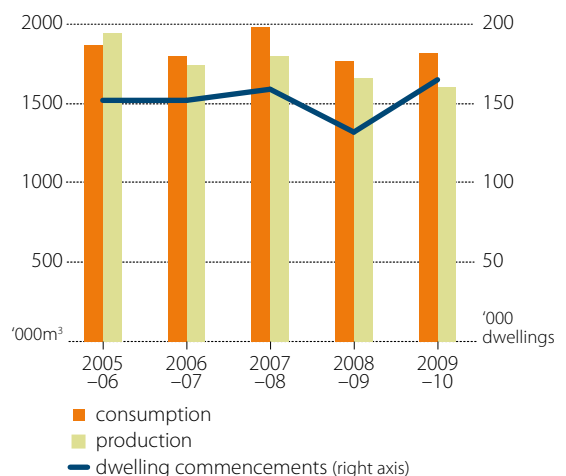
## Highlights in this issue

- This issue of *Australian forest and wood products statistics* (AFWPS) includes an update of the production and consumption volumes for wood-based panels and trade in forest products for 2009–10.
- Housing activity is one of the key indicators of domestic demand for structural wood products in Australia. After declining by 17 per cent in 2008–09, total dwelling commencements rebounded strongly in 2009–10, increasing by more than 25 per cent. This will have a positive effect on demand for wood-based panels and sawnwood in Australia.
- Weak demand in some of Australia’s major export markets continues to mitigate strong domestic demand conditions. The value of Australia’s forest product exports fell by 3.6 per cent to \$2.3 billion in 2009–10, driven mainly by a 14 per cent drop in the value of woodchip exports, while wood-based panel exports also declined by 14 per cent. Australia’s woodchip exports have declined in each of the past two years, falling from \$1.07 billion in 2007–08 to \$856 million in 2009–10. The principal factor in this decline is lower demand from Japanese paper producers, which remain the largest users of Australian woodchips.
- The value of roundwood exports increased by more than 36 per cent in 2009–10 to around \$138 million, representing almost 1.4 million cubic metres of logs. A significant proportion of these exports were coniferous logs exported to China. The value of paper and paperboard exports also increased strongly in 2009–10, rising by around 7 per cent to reach almost \$650 million.
- There was an overall rise in the import volumes of most forest products, with the exception of market pulp. However, the value of forest products imports fell by 5.8 per cent to \$4.2 billion in 2009–10. The fall was mainly a result of lower import unit values for most forest commodities—in particular, an 11 per cent decline in the unit price of printing and writing paper imports led to a 7.7 per cent decline in the value of imports, to \$1.4 billion in 2009–10.
- This issue of the AFWPS does not include updated data for plantation establishment; however, box 1 provides some detail about the expansion of plantation areas in Australia over the past decade.

## Production and consumption

- Domestic demand conditions for Australia’s structural wood products appear to have improved markedly over 2009–10, in response to increased building activity in all states and territories, following low housing activity in 2008–09. In 2009–10, total dwelling commencements rose by 25 per cent to 165 000 units, with the largest percentage rises in the ACT and Western Australia. New South Wales and Victoria also recorded strong housing growth.
- Reflecting strong domestic demand conditions, consumption of wood-based panels (excluding veneer) in Australia rose by

**box 1 Plantation establishment**

- The total area of Australia’s plantation estate increased by 2.4 per cent in 2009, from 1.97 million hectares to 2.02 million hectares.
- The total plantation area has increased by about 51 per cent in the past 10 years. The increase is mostly hardwood plantations, the area of which increased by more than 150 per cent in the past 10 years. In contrast, the area of softwood plantations increased by 8 per cent over the same period, albeit from a much larger base. Since 2005, the rate of increase in plantation establishment has slowed. Hardwood plantations now comprise 49 per cent of the plantation estate.
- The rate of increase in the plantation area since 2005 has been fastest in the Northern Territory, Tasmania, the north coast of New South Wales and north Queensland. The regions with the slowest rate of increase since 2005 include the Central Tablelands, the Murray Valley and other regions within the Murray–Darling Basin catchment.
- The total area of plantation forests in the Murray–Darling Basin is estimated to be around 292 000 hectares, which is about 0.3 per cent of the total Basin area. For the sub-catchments where most of the plantations are located (Murrumbidgee River, Upper Murray River and Lachlan–Macquarie rivers), the plantations account for about 4 per cent, 2.5 per cent and 1.5 per cent, respectively, of the catchment area.

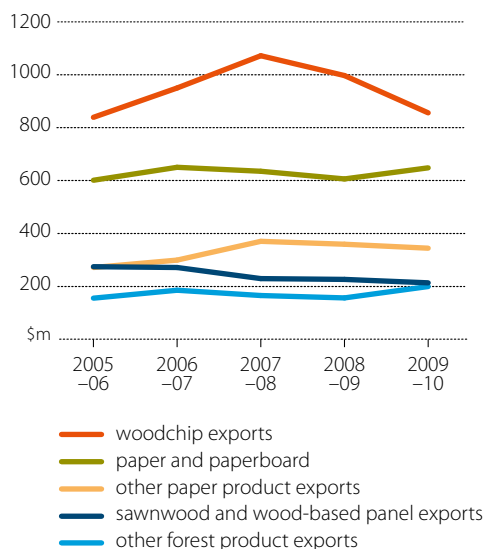
2.8 per cent in 2009–10 (figure 1), with a large rise in plywood offsetting a fall in medium density fibreboard consumption.

- Higher imports were the main contributor to the increased panel consumption. Australia’s wood-based panel production (excluding veneer) fell by 3.3 per cent to 1.6 million cubic metres in 2009–10. A 12 per cent fall in medium density fibreboard production offset a rise of almost 2 per cent in both plywood and particleboard production. The lower medium density fibreboard production indicates the effect of a reduction in processing capacity from the closure of Laminex’s plant in Western Australia in 2009.
- Against the trend of a downturn in international woodchip trade, in 2009–10 export-driven veneer production in Tasmania maintained the level reached in 2008–09 of more than 110 000 cubic metres. Most of this production was exported to Malaysia, although some exports went to New Zealand in 2009–10.

## Trade

- The overall value of imported forest products fell by 5.8 per cent to \$4.2 billion in 2009–10, relative to the previous year. The fall was mainly attributed to decreases in the value of imports of wood-based panels, paper and paperboard and market pulp. Against this trend, the value of sawnwood imports rose in 2009–10.
- While the total value of paper and paperboard imports fell by 4.4 per cent to \$2.2 billion in 2009–10, the volume imported rose by 5.4 per cent. In particular, the volume of printing and writing paper imports increased by 4.0 per cent to 1.2 million tonnes in 2009–10. However, an 11 per cent decline in the unit price of printing and writing paper imports resulted in a 7.7 per cent decline in the total value of these imports to \$1.4 billion.
- The value of pulp imports fell 32 per cent to \$178 million in 2009–10, as a result of a fall in both the volume and unit price of imports. Imports of pulp into Tasmania fell by more than 50 per cent to 30 000 tonnes in 2009–10, in line with the closure of two Tasmanian paper mills.
- The value of paper manufactures imports fell by 4.6 per cent to \$563 million in 2009–10, driven by declines in the value of imports from most of the major supplying countries.
- The value of imports of miscellaneous forest products also fell in 2009–10, by 7.3 per cent to \$603 million. Over this period, the value of mouldings imports from Indonesia fell marginally to \$108 million; however, they remained 36 per cent above the value of imports in 2007–08. For other miscellaneous imports, the value of imports of cork manufactures (mainly bottle corks), which are mainly supplied by France and Portugal, declined by 17 per cent. The value of imported corks declined from \$43.7 million in 2006–07 to \$17.9 million in 2009–10.
- The value of sawnwood imports increased by 6.0 per cent to almost \$430 million and the volume increased by 19 per cent to 748 000 cubic metres in 2009–10, indicating an increase in domestic demand for sawnwood in line with the recovery in housing activity. New Zealand, the largest supplier of coniferous sawnwood to Australia, accounted for the largest increase in sawnwood imports in 2009–10. There were also significant increases in the volume of imports from Estonia, Lithuania and Sweden.
- While import prices from New Zealand rose slightly, the unit price of imports from most other countries fell, partly reflecting the 17 per cent appreciation of the Australian dollar against the US dollar in 2009–10.
- The value of forest product exports decreased by 3.6 per cent to \$2.26 billion in 2008–09. This was a result of the continuing decline in the value of woodchip exports, which has fallen by 14 per cent from almost \$1 billion in 2008–09 to \$856 million in 2009–10, following a fall of 7 per cent in 2008–09. The value of log exports

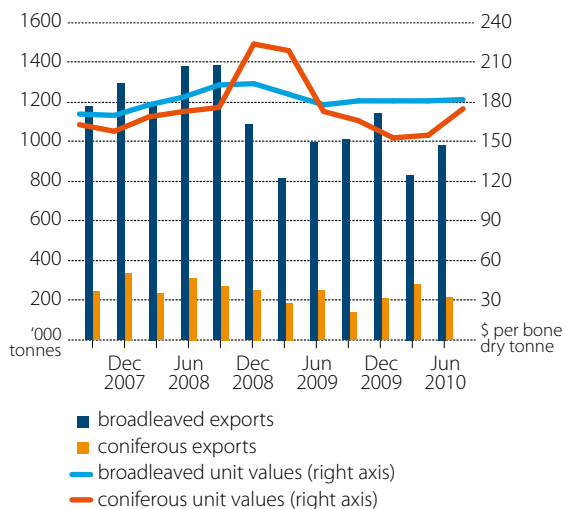
## 2 Forest sector exports



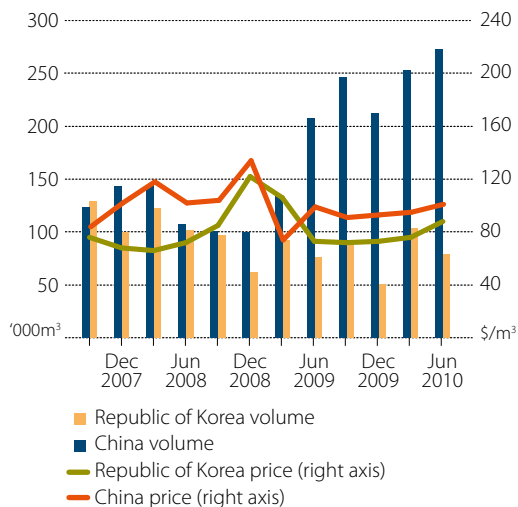
increased by 36 per cent to \$138 million, exceeding the value of sawnwood exports, while veneer exports and paper and paperboard exports increased by 21 per cent and 7.0 per cent, respectively, in 2009–10.

- The volume of woodchip exports decreased by 8.3 per cent to 4.8 million bone dry tonnes in 2009–10. The total value of woodchip exports fell by 14 per cent, because of falls in the unit price of broadleaved woodchip exports to China and Chinese Taipei and a large fall in the coniferous woodchip price.
- While the price of broadleaved woodchip exports to Japan increased by 1.6 per cent in 2009–10, the volume exported to Japan fell by 7.8 per cent, and the volume exported to China declined by 8.6 per cent. Significantly, there was a 96 per cent decline in the volume of broadleaved woodchips exported to the Republic of Korea, with the value of these exports declining from \$33 million in 2008–09 to \$0.5 million in 2009–10.
- Most of the decline in the volume of broadleaved woodchip exports was from Tasmania, where these exports declined by 19 per cent in 2009–10. In contrast, exports from hardwood plantations in Western Australia fell by only 2.4 per cent and exports from New South Wales increased over the year.
- The volume of coniferous woodchip exports fell by just more than 12 per cent and the value fell by almost 28 per cent to \$137 million in 2009–10, as the unit export price of coniferous woodchips declined by almost 18 per cent. Around 95 per cent of Australia’s coniferous woodchip exports are shipped to Japan, and 80 per cent of coniferous woodchip exports are exported from ports in Victoria.
- The value of paper and paperboard exports rose by 7.0 per cent to \$648 million in 2009–10. Increases were recorded across all paper categories, with the exception of household and sanitary products. The main contributor to the growth was a 15 per cent rise in the volume of packing and industrial paper exports to 708 000 tonnes.

- Exports of veneer continued to increase in 2009–10. The total volume of veneer exported was about 5 per cent above that in 2008–09, and the total value of exports was up by more than 21 per cent to \$44 million in 2009–10.
- While the value of sawnwood exports remained relatively unchanged in 2009–10, the value of roundwood exports increased by 36 per cent to \$138 million over the year. Exports to the Republic of Korea, previously the main market for roundwood, remained unchanged at just less than 325 000 cubic metres, while exports to China almost doubled to almost 1 million cubic metres.

## Methodology

The statistics reported in this publication are derived from a variety of sources. A list of the data sources and assumptions is provided in the footnotes of each table.

In general, all data relating to imports and exports have been compiled from information published monthly by the Australian Bureau of Statistics in *International Trade*, electronic data service (cat. no. 5464.0), which is supplemented with data sourced from industry organisations when available. Median monthly trade unit values have been used from January 2002 wherever the monthly unit value has fallen below the median value by 25 per cent.

Production data are sourced from the various state forest services and industry organisations, with some estimates derived from ABARE–BRS datasets.

Care should be taken when using Australian export statistics by commodity and destination because of data quality issues associated with volumes and unit values in disaggregated data.

All data are subject to revision.

A number of changes have been made to the presentation and content of recent editions of the AFWPS, based on feedback received from users of the publication and the associated datasets. ABARE–BRS is interested in the ongoing development of the AFWPS to ensure that data continue to be relevant and useful to as many users as possible.

### *Sawnwood production estimates*

The reliability and consistency of sawnwood production data has been of concern in recent years, particularly as a result of the cancellation of a number of state-based surveys by the Australian Bureau of Statistics and state government agencies since 2004. Before this date, ABARE (now ABARE–BRS) used these surveys for production estimates provided in the AFWPS.

For Australian sawnwood production estimates after 2004, ABARE–BRS has used a selection of alternative datasets. To provide a basis for these estimates, in 2006–07 ABARE undertook a national survey of sawmills, the results of which are included in the sawnwood production

tables 10 and 11. A summary of the survey, including the methodology, results and areas for further research, is available in the 2007 September and December quarters of the AFWPS.

For other data since 2004, ABARE–BRS has used data from the sawmill survey, together with other data such as log removals and sawnwood consumption, to estimate annual state-based sawnwood production.

### *Log removals from Australia's forests*

Each year, ABARE–BRS collects log removal and price data from a range of forest growers and major log purchasers as part of the survey of gross value of log production. These sources include crown native and plantation forest data from state forest agencies and data from major plantation companies. However, with the exception of Tasmania, there are no state-based central collection points for private native forest data.

Consequently, estimates of removals from this resource have relied on partial surveys of major processors that are known to purchase from private forest managers and on general estimates from forest industry experts.

This edition of the AFWPS contains some revisions to historical estimates of forest harvest volumes, based on ongoing data checking and discussions with some state forest agencies. In addition, removals of firewood for industrial and domestic purposes are not included in total removals because of inconsistencies in the definition and reporting of this log category across states.

### *National forest and plantation inventories*

Data on forest areas by forest type and tenure class and on plantation areas and plantings were provided by the National Forest Inventory and National Plantation Inventory.

## Definitions

Values presented in trade tables are 'value for duty' for imports and 'free on board' (fob) from Australian ports for exports.

Apparent consumption is defined as production plus imports minus exports. This excludes any allowances for change in inventory or interstate transfers.

Small discrepancies in totals are generally caused by rounding.

The National Forestry Inventory uses the following definitions for tree height:

- low—2 to 10 metres
- medium—11 to 30 metres
- tall—greater than 30 metres

and the following terminology for forest area:

- closed forest—areas with trees more than 2 metres tall and with a canopy cover greater than 80 per cent
- open forest—areas with trees more than 2 metres tall and with a canopy cover between 50 and 80 per cent
- woodland—areas with trees more than 2 metres tall and with a canopy cover of between 20 and 50 per cent.
