### SPECIAL PROGRAMS

#### Remember the Holocaust - 15 - 30 June 2010

What was the Holocaust? Why did it happen? How can knowledge of Holocaust history and the experiences of survivors be applied to current events and social issues? Includes a visit to the *Remember the Holocaust* exhibition and a group discussion with Holocaust survivor, local artist Andrew Steiner. 2 hours / Years 7-adult

#### Post-war Migration - Until October 2010

Nearly two million people arrived from Europe in the 1950's and 1960's including large numbers of non-British Europeans. Why did they come? What difficulties did they face? How did they change Australia? In what ways did Australia change them? Includes a visit to the exhibition *Home is Where the Heart is: South Australian Immigrants in the 1950's and 60's*. 60 minutes / Years 7-12

### ONGOING PROGRAMS

**Immigration: An Overview:** Journey through South Australian immigration and contact history. Explore concepts of cultural diversity and identity. 60 minutes / Years 3-12

**Life in Colonial South Australia:** A focus on why early immigrants migrated to South Australia and on the life they created here. 60 minutes / Years R-7

**Children in 19th Century South Australia:** An exciting introduction to history through children's play, work, dress and education. 90 minutes / Years R-5

**20th & 21st Century Immigration:** Students are challenged to think critically about the concepts of multiculturalism and identity. 60 minutes / Years 7-12

**The Impact of European Settlement on the Aboriginal Peoples of South Australia:** A powerful and challenging role-play that examines South Australia's history from another perspective. Up to 2 hours / Years 5-12

**Whose History?** Examines how history is constructed and recorded, who is included and who is left out. 90 minutes / Years 3-10

**Women in South Australia:** A social history approach to explore and reflect on the lives of South Australian women. Ideal for students of Women's Studies. 60 minutes / Years 8-12

#### Cultural Collisions: the consequences of conflict

Through a discovery trail and talking with veterans and survivors of wars, learners will be able to pose questions about wars and their consequences. Up to 2 hours / Years 6-12
